distinguished scholar matthew leveraging examines the doctrine of creation and its contemporary theological implications critically engaging with classical and modern views in dialogue with orthodox and reformed interlocutors among others moving from the trinity to christology leveraging takes up a number of themes pertaining to the doctrine of creation and focuses on how creation impacts our understandings of both the immanent and the economic trinity he also engages newer trends such as

ecological theology

in keeping with the scriptural witness and the theological heritage this remarkable book examines the doctrine of creation alongside new creation the connection between the two creation and new creation has drawn renewed attention in the last several decades but the burden of sean mcdonough s argument is that this emphasis on creation and new creation has been a feature of the doctrine since the beginning whether in the eschatological reading of genesis 1 that predominated at least until early modern times or the intertwining of the narratives of creation and redemption in thinkers from irenaeus to barth whilst covering the traditional elements of the doctrine mcdonough treats the important subject with a special emphasis on how these unfold in the story of what gunton has called god s creation project

what does it mean to both affirm the goodness of god s creation and anticipate the new creation bringing together contributions from church leaders academic theologians and scientists on the doctrine of creation this volume engages with scripture scientific theory church history and current issues to help christians understand the beginning and ending of god s good creation

if we pick up the bible as god s word and at the beginning read with trepidation then the whole of the bible is so read this book was written to help christians navigate some of the forces of modernity which have crept into the church and influenced the way christians view the reliability of the biblical creation account and more

generally the bible its purpose is to encourage readers to see the steadfastness of god s word as a way of making sense of our lives and the world we live in it hopes to show that a faith based historical reading of gen 1 3 provides a more trustworthy explanation of reality than atheistic evolutionary theories or reading the genesis story as a make believe myth but the book is not a polemic per se it proposes a faith based historical reading of the creation story in hopes of learning more about god creation and ourselves

understanding of creation and the relation between theology and science he was on the staff of the chicago center for religion and science he was the author of visions of a future a study of christian eschatology from the new theology studies series published by the liturgical press
